




Facilities Update

District Update: Annual School Climate Survey MARSH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL




Cumulative percentage rating for Sustaining in survey results 2021-2022 2022-2023



General Fund Revenue:

- General Fund State Aid increased \$1,102,684 (Equalization Aid) and \$6,453 (Medicaid Reimbursement) in 2023-24 from 2022-23
- Withdrawals were made from Capital Reserve and Tuition Reserve
 - Tuition Reserve \$123,745
 - Assist in Tuition Adjustments from Pleasantville and ACIT
 - Capital Reserve \$832,000
 - Replace HVAC at Attales






Absecon School 2023-24 Budget General Fund - Proportionate Breakdown
